for Letters of Administration upon his dece-

to your Honor may deem necessary in the
premises.

Know all men by these presents, THAT J. Tressvant
I. C. Hawpe as principal, and A. M. Burford

for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, ex-
ecutors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, signed and sealed
with our seals, the seals being scrawled this 26th day of September A. D. 1855

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION is such, that, whereas, the above bound-
den I. C. Hawpe has been appointed by the Chief
Justice of Dallas County administrator of the
Estate of A. Gove deceased,

Now, if the said I. C. Hawpe shall well and truly perform all the du-
ties required of him by law, under said appointment, then this obligation shall be null and
void; otherwise, to be and remain in full force and effect.
