the County Judge of the county of Dallas, in the sum of Three
Thousand Dollars, for the payment of which,
well and truly to be made unto the said County Judge, we bind ourselves, our heirs, exec-
utors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Signed with
our hands, and sealed with our seals, the Third day of
June A. D. 1870

The Condition of the above obligation is such, That whereas the above
bound Samuel Crossley. has been appointed
Administrator of the Estate of William Griffeth, deceased.
Now, if the said Samuel Crossley shall well and truly
perform all the duties required of him under said appointment, then this obliga-
tion shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
