State and County aforesaid, in view of the uncer-
tainty of life, and the certainty and being desirous
to dispose of my effects in a manner dictated to
me by the laws of the state of Texas, I do hereby
make this my Last will and Testament as
follows To wit, —

1st I will and bequeath that after my demise

expenses paid, —

2^d I will and bequeath that all my property
Money and Effects of every kind and character
with the exception herein after specified be and

Nephew whom I have raised, and who has
been to me as a Son,

3^d I will and bequeath to Thomas Daniel one
Cow and Calf,

4^t I will and bequeath to
E. B. Harwood one Cow and Calf —

5th I will and bequeath that Francis Asbury
Winn shall be my Executor to dispose of my
estate according to the directions of this my said will
and testament, & I will that my estate shall not
be controlled or in any way disposed of in the
Probate Court, but that my last will & testament
be executed by my said Executor, without his being
required to give Bonds, or any interference of
the County or the County whatsoever, In witness

First, It is my will, that after my death my body
be decently interred

Secondly, It is my will, that all expenses attending
my last sickness be fully paid

Thirdly, As I owe no debts I make no provision for
their payment

Fourthly, After the above expenses are paid and a
charged, the residue of my estate, whether con-
sisting of cattle, horses, promissory notes or mo-
ney, and any and all other property of what kind
soever, of which I may die possessed, I give and
bequeath to my beloved nephew Francis Hall
for his sole use and benefit.

Likewise, I make, constitute, and appoint my
said nephew Francis Hall to be executor of
this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
all former wills by me made

In witness whereof, I have hereunto subscribed
my name and affixed my seal, using scroll
for seal, the Twenty fifth day of February in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
sixty three.
