Relief of Ermine Reed. An Estate Court  
Dallas County

To the County Judge of Dallas County  
from petitioner  
Joseph Reed of the County of Dallas State of Texas  
would respectfully represent that on the or about the  
in the month of 1879.  
he filed in your Honorable Court a petition containing  
substantially the following allegations & prayer:

averred that he was a citizen of Dallas County and the husband  
and of Ermine Reed. That said Ermine Reed had  
died at his and her home in Dallas County from the  
effect of a surgical operation on about the 6<sup>th</sup> of  
August a d 1879. That her estate estimates at  
\$5000. lay mainly in Dallas County and that just  
previous to the operation upon which she died, she gave  
into the custody of Dr John H Stevens her own &  
the attendant dangerous her last will and testament  
which will was filed with petition. It further prayed  
that after notice and hearing said will might be pro-  
bated and for general relief.

Your petition further avers that said will was sub-  
stantially as follows:

Rockcastle August 5<sup>th</sup> 1879.

I wish my darling husband Joseph to have all  
that we possess in case that I die before him signed

Petitioners would further represent that on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1879 said petition, after due notice given according to law as shown by the sheriff's return, was called for hearing and Dr John H. Stevens Dr B. W. Allen W. A. Cummings, Esq.  
H. C. Cole.

Pierce J. M. Cockrell, & your petitioners having been sworn testified substantially as is set down below and their testimony was written down subscribed by them and by filing made a part of the record of your Hon Court

Dr John H. Stevens testified that he was a physician and resident of Dallas County. That he was well acquainted with Emma Reed, and Joseph Reed was her husband at the time of her death. He was one of the surgeons assisting in the operation from which she died. Just before the operation was begun, before any ether or chloriform was administered Mrs Emma Reed gave to him the paper which is here in court asking him to read it and take care of it as her will in case she died. Being unable to read without spectacles he handed it to Dr. Allen who read it aloud here in the presence of Mrs Reed her husband himself and others, and then delivered it to him. The paper here in court is the same paper. Mrs Reed was in full possession of her faculties at the time. She died in a day or two afterwards from the operation at her home in Dallas County.

Dr B. W. Allen testifies that he was one of the assisting surgeons at the operation for ovarian tumor performed upon Mrs Emma Reed at her home in Dallas County in the month of August 1879. Knew her as the wife of Joseph Reed the petitioner. Just before

Mrs Reed took her place upon the table for the operation  
and before any ether or Chloroform had been administered  
to her she gave to Dr Stevens the paper now in court  
and asked him to read it as her last will and testament.  
She handed it to me and I read it aloud and re-  
turned it to him. The same paper is here in court.  
She was then in full possession of all her faculties  
and capable of making a will. She died in a day  
or two afterwards at her home from the operations.

Mr W. L. Cummings testified that he was  
a resident of Dallas County and knew Joseph Reed  
and Emasie Reed well. They were husband and  
wife at the time of Mrs Reed's death. He knew Ema-  
sie Reed's handwriting. The paper in court was in  
her handwriting and wholly written by her.

Mr E. Y. Price testified that he knew Emasie  
Reed's handwriting. That the paper here shown him  
in court was in her handwriting and wholly written  
by her. She was twenty-one years of age.

Mr J. W. Cockrell testified that he was the  
nephew of Mrs Emasie Reed the late wife of Joseph  
Reed and knew her handwriting. The paper shown  
him here in court was written by her in toto.  
He was of age and a practicing attorney.

Mr G. H. Cole testified that he knew the  
handwriting of Mrs Emasie Reed. That the paper  
in court was in her handwriting and wholly  
written by her.

Your petitioner then testifies that he was the husband of Ennasie Reed - That she died in August 1879 at his home in Dallas County leaving a property mortgaged lying in Dallas County estimated at \$5000. The paper here is copied the same paper my wife handed Dr. Stevens before the operation I knew of it for the first time when I heard it read by Dr. Allen It is all in her handwriting

Your petitioner would further represent that after considering the evidence above Your Honor entered an order for the probation of said will and the judgment of probation was fully executed this judgment embraced substantially the testimony above given and the decree of the court probating

Your petition would further represent that since wait one the 4th day of February 1880 the Court House with all the records in this case except the order of probation was burned - Wherefore he prayeth that after notice to parties interested as in the original case the <sup>copy</sup> record of original petition, notice, sheriffs return, testimony and judgment of court probating herein substantially given may be substituted for the original record, and this by decree of your Honr Court reaffirming the decree of probation And for general relief
