make and publish this my last will and
testament.

I will First that my beloved wife
Elizabeth J. Thomas for and during her
life have entire control of all the property,
both real and personal, of which I may
die seized and possessed, or to which I am
or may become entitled, with full power
in her to sell and dispose of the same
or any part thereof as I might do if living,
only directing that if she find it necessary
to sell real estate, that she sell first the tract
on Rockot Creek being a part of the Reason Crst
Survey and at her death the property to
go to our children share and ^{she} alike -

Second That immediately after my
death my son Oliver shall have set apart
to him five acres off of my Thomas-
head Tract to be known as the North
West corner of said tract so as to front
(400) four hundred feet on the McKinney
road - which shall be valued at one
thousand dollars, and deducted from
his share off my estate on final division
thereof.

Third That no action be had in the
courts of the country with reference to my
