

Court that he can now <sup>said man & wife</sup> make an arrangement by which the said minors can obtain a complete and perfect title to the said six hundred acres of land and all improvements thereon, by compromise; The Guardian would further represent that it will be greatly to the advantage of said minors to effect the arrangement aforesaid, but that in order to do so it will be necessary to sell lands belonging to said minors to pay off Court Costs and to carry out said arrangement.

The Guardian now specifically represents that he is desirous of selling the 370 acres of unimproved land in Ellis County and of applying the proceeds thereof to the payment of Court Costs and to buying in and compensating such <sup>said man & wife</sup> Euana Mills and M.B. 




