all others heretofore by me made.

Item 1st. I give, bequeath and devise to my  
beloved wife, Caroline Hammyer, all of my  
property both real and personal wherever  
and whatever it may be of which I may die  
seized and possessed or to which I may be  
entitled at the time of my death.

Item 2nd. I hereby constitute and appoint  
my beloved wife Caroline Hammyer sole  
executrix of this my last will and testament,  
without bond, and direct that no further  
action be had in the probate Court than  
to probate and record this will and to  
approve and receive an inventory of my  
Estate.
