

Student performance on TAAS improved again in 1995–96, with the greatest increases occurring in mathematics. Among the major ethnic groups, African American students showed the greatest gains. Performance of the 1.5 million students tested each spring is one indicator used to rate schools and districts as part of the state's Public School Accountability System.
