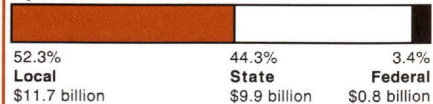

By Source

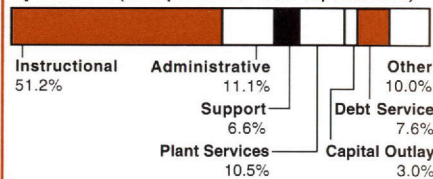
