 in open Court dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May 1887  
 signed Jennie Scollard and witnessed by  
 Chas. D. Polanz & Arch<sup>d</sup> C. Abrams was signed  
 by said Jennie Scollard in the presence of  
 Affiant and said Arch<sup>d</sup> C. Abrams on  
 the date above written, and that Affiant and  
 Arch<sup>d</sup> C. Abrams signed said instrument as  
 witnesses at the request of Jennie Scollard  
 and in her presence and in the presence of  
 each other, and that said Jennie Scollard  
 then and there declared such instrument  
 to be her last will and testament. Affiant  
 is over fourteen years of age and said  
 Scollard at the time above mentioned
