James B. Jackson, of said County and State, being in good health and of
sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this, my last
will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time hereto-
fore made:

First- I direct that all my just debts shall be paid, and that
the legacies hereinafter given shall, after the payment of my debts, be
paid out of my estate.

Second- I give and bequeath to my wife, Mary Jackson, Ten Dollars
in money, to be paid to her as soon as convenient after my death by my
executrix.

Third- I give and bequeath One Dollar, to be paid out of my estate
to each of my children, hereafter named, to-wit:

John H. Jackson, James B. Jackson, my daughter, Mary B. Graham, David
Jackson, William Jackson, Abb Stell Jackson and ^{Larinda} ~~Marriott~~ Marriott.

Fourth- I give and bequeath to my daughter, Mrs. Jennie A. Mahony
of Dallas County, Texas, all the remainder of my estate, both real and
personal that I may own and be possessed of at the time of my decease.

Fifth- I nominate and appoint my said daughter, Mrs. Jennie A.
Mahony, executrix of this my last will and testament, and direct that
no security be required of her as my executrix.

Sixth- It is my will that no other action shall be had in the
County Court in the administration of my estate, than to prove and re-
cord this will, and to return an inventory and appraisement of my estate.
