Edwin Smith, of the City of Dallas, in the
County of Dallas and State of Texas, being in
good health, and of sound and disposing
mind and memory, do make and publish
this my last will and testament, hereby revok-
ing all former wills by me at any time hereto-
fore made.

My family consists of my beloved wife
Magdalene Smith and her two children
Hugh G. Smith who has adopted my name
and Eulalia now intermarried with A. S.
Alston which said Hugh G. and Eulalia
I do hereby adopt as my own children, having
none born to me who are now living.

First. I direct that all my just debts shall
be paid without delay.

Second. All of my estate of whatever kind of
which I shfull die seized and possessed, or to
which I shall be entitled at the time of my
decease, I give, devise and bequeath to my
beloved wife, Magdalene, to have and to
hold the same to her, her heirs and assigns,
to her and their use and behoof forever.

Third. Inasmuch as no provision is herein

made for either the said Hugh C. Smith or the said Eulalie Atston, I desire to say in all kindness for the former, that I am convinced that no provision which I could make would be of any permanent benefit to him, also with due regard and care for the welfare of the latter, I have full confidence that her mother, the said Magdalene will in the end make ample provision for her.

Fourth. I nominate and appoint my beloved wife the said Magdalene sole executrix of this my will and direct that no security be required of her as such.

Fifth. It is my will that no other action shall be had in the County Court in the administration of my estate than to prove and record this will.
