Your petitioner
W. A. Rodgers who resides in Dallas County,
Texas, respectfully presents:

That heretofore on the 6th ult Dec 5th 1889,
M. Donohue departed this life in the City
of Dallas, Dallas County, Texas. That the said
M. Donohue was at the time of his death
a resident of Dallas County, Texas and had his
domicile there, and his principal property
was situated in said Dallas County, Texas at
the time of his death.

That the estate of the said M. Donohue con-
sists of real estate of the probable value of
~~\$12,000~~ and of personal property of the reason-
able value of \$1000.

That the said M. Donohue left a last
will and testament in which petitioner
is named and appointed as the sole ex-
ecutor of the said last will and testament of
the said M. Donohue. That said will is hereto
attached marked Exhibit A and made a part of
this application. That by said will it is provided
that "no further action to be taken over my
estate by the County Court, further than to
probate this my will - qualify my executors herein
appointed, return an inventory of my estate and
return a list of claims against the same".

Petitioner further states that he is over the
age of twenty-one years and is not disquali-
fied by law from accepting letters of admin-
istration upon the estate of the said M. Donohue.

That the persons to whom his estate is willed

by the said M. Donohue as all non-residents of the State of Texas.

Wherefore petitioner prays that notice of this application, with citation, be given as required by law, that the said last will and testament of M. Donohue be probated as the last will and testament of the said M. Donohue and that letters of administration be issued to petitioner upon the said estate of the said M. Donohue, and that his appointment as executor in said will be confirmed by the court.

And petitioner further represents to the court that the greater portion of the estate of the said M. Donohue consists of improved real estate in Dallas and East Dallas, Texas which property was rented to tenants at the time of the death of the said M. Donohue, that there is no one now authorized to receive or collect said rents which amount totals to about the sum of \$400⁰⁰ per month. That there is a balance in the hands of the former agents of the said M. Donohue of about \$150⁰⁰ for rents collected, and a balance to his credit in the bank with which he did business of \$345⁴⁵. That there is also a small amount of personal property belonging to the estate of the said M. Donohue which should be taken care of and attended to. Petitioner also states that the state and county taxes on the property of the said M. Donohue for 1889 are unpaid and will become delinquent on Jan 1, 1890 and that they should be paid by that time to avoid expense.
