

In compliance with a commission issued to me out of the probate court of Dallas County Texas by the County clerk of said County I have this caused to appear before me J.W.Throckmorton S.J.B.Plemmons and Mrs. L.D.Allison and first duly swearing the according to law proceeded to propound the interrogatories attached to said commission and their annswers were as follows.

S.J.B.Plemmons was first sworn and answered as follows.


My name is S.J.B.Plemmons.Age 56. 2 Reside in the town of M'Kinney. Was in no way related to the deceased Harriett Reeves. I knew the deceased nearly all her life. I do not remember but think she was about 30 years old . she was married at the time of her death. She was marri ed to E.F.Reeves and had two children.

Deceased died in the town of Makinney she was liveing in said town at the time of her death and had been for some time previous.

I was present at the time the will attached to the commission was executed and believe that the date on it (Feb. 15th 1890) is correct I witnessed the execution of said will in the presence of the deceased but not at her request. There was present J.W.Throckmorton Mrs L. D.

Allison and others whose names I do not now remember. The will hereto attached is the one I signed as a witness and purport ed to be the last will of Marriett Reeves . She did not request me to sign said will . I do not believe she was excious at the time of the execution of the will or was capable of understanding anything contained therein. She made her mark in my presenct by other parties putt ing the pen in her hand and assisting her to do it. I was in the room where she was lying sick when I signed it but do not believe that she know any thing about it.

J.W.Throckmorton wrote the will . I do not know who suggested the pro priety of its execution. J. B. Plemmon

I was present on the 15th day of Feb. 1890 and witnessed the execution of the will made by the deceased, and signed the same in her present and in the presence of the other subscribeing witnesses who were besides myself Mrs L.D.Allison and S.J.B.Plenmons. The will attached hereto was the will we signed. My signature to the will is genuine and the will is the one I signed. I cannot say that she fully understood me when I ask her if ashe wanted me and the other witnesses to sign the will. I do not believe that she was of sound mind at the time. She made her mark in my present. I signed the will in the 170m wher she was but I do not believe that she could either see or distinctly hear what was going on.

I wrote the will. Her mother my wife told me that she wanted them the deceased wanted the will written and I wrote it from what her Mother told me was her wishes as well as she understood them and with out consulting the deceased it I wrote the will as I thought she desired it. When I read it over to her I could not tell that she understood it and when it was presented to her to sign she made several efforts but could not write her name and seeing that she could not write her name what she could not write her name what she had being on the pen I made her mark.
