Now comes J. W. Thompson, Temporary Administrator of the Estate of Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, deceased, and files this his report containing a list of all the property that has come into his hands as administrator; A statement of all monies received and collected by him on trutor; A statement of all disbursements made by him on account of account of said Estate, of all disbursements made by him on account of said Estate, and a full exhibit and account of all his acts as such administrator.

This Administrator shows that immediately upon his appointment as temporary administrator, on or about July X5th., 1901, he make deligent search for all title papers and inquiries for all property belonging to said estate, and as the result of said search and inquiries, took possession of all the property mentioned and described in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "Al" hereto attached, and comprising, so far as this administrator has been able to discover, all the property belonging to said estate; that the interest of the said Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers in said property is fully designated in said Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "A 1"; that this administrate. Found among the title papers above referred to deeds to lots number one and two in Block forty-five in the City of Oklahoma, Oklahoma Territory; that he has not been able to determine whether said lots have been sold by deceased and has, therefore, included them in said inventory. It may be developed later, however, that said lots are not properly a part of her said Retate; that the personal property mentioned in Exhibit "Al" consisting of a lot of house-hold goods and kitchen furniture described in said Exhibit "A 1" is situated upon the family homestead of William A. Rodmers, deceased, and Mrs. M. Plorence Rodgers, deceased, No. 192 Masten Street, and is all community property. There is

some controversy between the heirs of William A. Rodgers, deceased and Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, deceased, as to said house-hold goods and affects, but that this administrator is not advised that there is any other personal property on said home place, the property of said estate.

This Adminsitrator further shows that immediately upon his appointment he set about collecting the insurance policies mentioned in the order of this Court and executing the further commands of the Court embodied in the order appointing him such temporary administrator; that on the 20th., day of July, 1901, he rented the property No. 158 San Jacinto Street, as he was, by the court, directed to do, to one T. L. Luther for the sum of fifty-five dollars; that a short time prior to the death of Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, thechouse known as No. 158 San Jacinto Street had been partially destroyed by fire, and that the said wrs. M. Florence Rodgers had made a contract with one H. P. Self for the repair of the same in the sum of \$ 1060 ; that said building had been insured against damage by fire in the Georgia Home Insurance Company and in the Hamburg-Bremen Fire Insurance Company; that this administrator collected said insurance policies, took charge of the building No. 158 San Jacinto Street, saw that Self, the Contractor, completed his contract and paid and settled with him in accordance with the terms of said contract made and entered into by and between him and the said Mrs. M. Plorence Redgers; that there were certain other repairs not embraced in the contract with Self such as plumbing and tin work that was absolutely necessary in order to rent said property, which necessary repairs this administrator had made at a reasonable cost; that this administrator, as he had been directed by the Court to do, collected the interest of this Estate in two policies of insurance on the life of William A. Rodgers, one in the Equitable Life Assurance Society in the sum of one thousand and seventy-five, (\$1,075.00) Dollars and the other in the sum of seventeen hundred and eleven, (\$1,711.00) dollars in the Aetna Life Insurance Company. That said last mentioned policy was made payable to Mrs. M.

Florence Rodgers and the crildren of William A. Rodgers and Mrs. M. Plorence Rodgers. At the time said policy was issued, there were six children living of the said William A. and M. Florence Rodgers; that about 1890 one of said children, A. Sessums Rodgers, died; that of said policy for seventeen hundred and eleven dollars above mentioned, the estate of Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers was entitled to one-seventh and to one-half of one-seventh; the said one-half being inherited by her estate from the said A. Sessums Radgers; that out of the seventeen hundred and eleven dollars, so collected by this administrator, he retained one-seventh, to-wit: \$244.43 and one-fourteenth, to-wit: \$122.20, and the remainder thereof was paid to the children then surviving of the said William A. and M. Florence Rodgers, who were entitled to the same; that under the order of this court, this administrator rented such rooms as he was able in the dwelling known as No. 192 Masten Street; that Exhibit "B" hereto attached contains a full and itemized statement of all collections from insurance companies and from rents and from every source that has come into the hands of this administrator. That Exhibit "C" hereto attached, and made a part of this report, contains all the expenditures made by this administrator for account of said estate. This administrator deems it proper to show to the court that the building 192 Masten Street was the home of William A. and M. Florence Rodgers and that for many years prior to their deaths furnished rooms were rented to the public in said building; that this administrator continued to rent such rooms as he was able upon his appointment upon the order of this court. That in order to rent said rooms it was necessary that the same should be attended to; that lights and water and a telephone should be provided and some other small expenses in order that said rooms might be made habitable and desirable for occupancy, and all such expenses and expenditures are fully itemized and set forth in Exhibit "C" hereto attached, and were alloconsidered necessary by said administrator in order to enable him to secure tenants for said rooms and he asks the approval of the court of his actions in this behalf.

This administrator further shows that there is now in his hands

This administrator further shows that William A. Rodgers had a make . policy in the Equitable Life Assurance Society hereinabove mentioned for the sum of one thousand and seventy-five dollars payable to Mrs. M. Plorence Rodgers; that while said policy was being adjusted, and prior to the death of the said Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, W. M. Watard, the agent for the Equitable Life Assurance Society, advanced to the said Mrs. M. Plorence Rodgers the sum of twenty-five dollars under the agreement with the said Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers that the said W.M. Waters, who was the agent of the company aforesaid and through whose hands said one thousand and seventy-five dollars would be paid to the said Mrs. M. Plorence Rodgers would retain out of the said sum the said sum of twentyfive dollars so advanced Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, and thus reimburse himself. That at the time said policy was paid, the said Waters was out of the State and said sum of twenty-five dollars was not retained or paid over to him, but the entire amount of one thousand and seventy-five dollars was paid to this administrator; that all the heirs of William A/ and Mrs. M. Florence Rodgers, deceased, have requested this administrator to pay over to the said Waters the said sum of twenty-five dollars, said request being in writing and is hereto attached and marked "Exhibit C N. Wherefore, this administrator respectfully asks that his authority as administrator be enlarged and that he be ordered to pay over to the said Waters said sum of twenty-five dollars, as aforesaid. This administrator further asks that the sum of \$ 400. \_\_ be allowed him for commissions on receipts and disburserents and for further services rendered said estate; that this report be approved by this Honorable Court, and such orders be made on the premises as to this court may seem proper and right, and that this administrator be finally discharged, as in duty bound he will ever pray.


