Know all men by these presents that we, David Langton as  
principal, and ..... and .....  
..... as sureties, are held and firmly bound unto the County Judge  
of the County of Dallas, in the State of Texas, and to his successors  
in office in the sum of Ten thousand and two hundred (\$10,200.00) dol-  
lars, conditioned that the above bound David Langton, who has been ap-  
pointed survivor of the Community Estate of himself and Mary Ann Lang-  
ton, his wife now deceased, will faithfully administer the said Com-  
munity Estate of Mary Ann Langton and himself, and pay over one-half  
the surplus thereof after the payment of the debts with which the  
whole of said property is properly chargeable, to such persons as  
shall be entitled to receive the same.

Witness our hands and seals, this 8th day of July A.D. 1890.

Lot No. 4 in Block 1 in Eakins' Addition to the City of Dallas, in Dallas County, Texas, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a stake on Harwood Street, the north cor. of said lot No. 4; thence South 45° W. 120 feet to a stake; thence S. 45° E. 150 feet to a stake; thence N. 24° E. 140 feet to a stake on Harwood Street; thence N. 51 1/4° W. 100 feet on Harwood St. to the place of beginning and containing 16250 square feet of land.
