

Your Petitioner L E Merrifield respectfully represents, that your petitioner is a resident of the county of Dallas and State of Texas, that J W Merrifield, a resident of the county of Dallas and state of Texas, departed this life in said county on the 6th. day of September 1868 leaving a written will duly executed bearing date the 30th. day of July 1873 whereby he disposed of all of his estate, and therein named your petitioner as the executrix thereon, which said will is here with filed. That said John W Merrifield died seized and possessed of real and personal property in Dallas county of the probable value of thirty five thousand dollars. That your petitioner is not disqualified from acting as executrix of said will. Wherefore your petitioner prays that due notice hereof be given as required by law, that said will be admitted to probate and for letters testamentary and for all general and special relief and as in duty bound she will ever pr.

Know all men by these presents That I John
W. Merrifield, of the County of Dallas and State of
Texas, being impelled with the uncertainty of human
life and being desirous of disposing of my pro-
perty as provided by the Laws of the State and
being free of bonds bound out memory, do
make and publish this my last will and testa-
ment, hereby revoking any and all other wills
by me heretofore made.

First - It is my will and desire that all my
just debts be paid.

Second - I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife L. E. Merrifield, all my property and
charactes both real and personal, to be in her uses
and disposure of it to her as appear proper, for
the interest, support and maintenance of herself
and our several children so long as she may
remain my widow, but in case of her marrying
again, then my said property out of effect, to be
equally divided among our children.

Third - I direct that my wife L. E. Merrifield
execute of this my last will and testament and
desire that she shall not be required to give bond
or security, but provide that the Probate Court shall
take no further action in the premises than to
probate this will, and admit the same to record
and receive and have record as instrument of
my effect. Witness my hand this 30th day of
July A.D. 1873 O. H. Merrifield

Estate of John W Merrifield - Deed

Be it remembered that on the 4th day of March
1878 A.D. personally appeared J M Foggeman
who being duly sworn in open court deposes
and says that he was personally well acquainted
with John W Merrifield - and found him
for more than twenty years before his death
that said John W Merrifield is dead and
that he died in Dallas County Texas on or
about the 8th day of Sept. 1878. That
affiant signed the instrument to this
deed bearing date the 30th day of July
1873. and purporting to be the last will of
John W Merrifield as a witness thereto in the
presence and at the request of said John
W Merrifield - and in the presence of A
Harwood - and E H Nichols - the other
subscribing witnesses and that said A Harwood
and E H Nichols - signed said instrument
in the presence of and at the request of said
John W Merrifield - and in the presence of
affiant - that at the time of the execution
of said instrument said John W Merrifield
declared to affiant and said Harwood
and Nichols that said instrument was
in said John W Merrifield's last will and
testament - that at the time of said
execution of said instrument the said
John W Merrifield was of sound mind
and memory - and about the age of 21 years
to wit about fifty years of age - that the
said E H Nichols was also the age of twenty
one years to wit about thirty years of age
and that said A Harwood was about

fifty years of age.
