Temporary Administrator. In the County Court of Dallas county,
Texas, sitting for Probate, and other like matters.)

To Hon. E. G. Bower, Judge of said Court:

Now comes Frank A.
Mohrhardt, Temporary Administrator herein, by his attorney S. S.
Long, and shows to the Court that he is unavoidably and temporarily
absent from Dallas county, and therefore unable to file his list
of the property that has come into his hands in this estate, to-
gether with an exhibit of all his acts and doings in the premises.
He shows that he will return to the city and county of Dallas on
or about the 20th day of February, 1889, when he will promptly
file said report and account, for the action of the court there-
on; wherefore he asks the Court to make an order extending in
force the temporary letters of administration heretofore granted
to petitioner, to such time as to the Court may seem expedient and
proper.

Final Exhibit of Frank A. Mohrhardt, Temp. Admr.

To Hon. E. G. Bower, Judge of said Court:

Now comes Frank A. Mohrhardt, Temporary Administrator herein, and files this, his full exhibit and accounting of all his acts as Temporary Administrator in this case, and shows:

That he has received from The City National Bank, of Dallas, Texas, the sum of \$ 1675 ^x, deposited in said bank to the credit of Louis E. Mohrhardt, dec'd; that this is all the property belonging to said estate which has come to the knowledge of your administrator; and that there are no debts owing to, or by said estate, known to him. He *shows* that said sum of money is still in his hands. He shows that he is the brother of, and sole heir of said Louis E. Mohrhardt, dec'd, and entitled to receive said estate; wherefore said Frank A. Mohrhardt prays the Court to make such orders as will confirm in him the title to said money; and that his exhibit and account be approved, and he discharged.

In the County Court of Dallas county, Texas, April 29th,1889.

This day the final exhibit of Frank A.Mohrhardt,
Temporary Administrator, coming on to be heard, and the same having
been fully examined and understood by the court, said Exhibit is
hereby approved.

And it appearing that Frank A.Mohrhardt, temporary ad-
ministrator, has collected into his possession \$1875.00, the same
being all of the estate of Louis E.Mohrhardt,dec'd, and that no
debts are due to or by said estate; and it appearing that said
Frank A.Mohrhardt is the sole heir of his brother Louis E.Mohr-
hardt, dec'd, said Frank A.Mohrhardt is hereby declared to be the
sole heir of said deceased and entitled to his entire estate.

It is further ordered that upon the payment of all costs
herein, said Frank A.Mohrhardt, Temporary Administrator be dis-
charged finally.

It having been shown to me that Louis E. Mohrhardt, late a resident citizen of the county of Dallas, in the State of Texas, died in Dallas county on the 8th day of November, A.D. 1888, intestate, and leaving personal property of the value of \$1875.00, (sixteen hundred and seventy five dollars,) the same being money deposited in The City National Bank of Dallas, Texas, to the credit of said Louis E. Mohrhardt, and that the interest of said estate requires the immediate appointment of a Temporary Administrator; it is ordered that Frank A. Mohrhardt, of Dallas county, State of Texas, be and he is hereby appointed Temporary Administrator of the Estate of the said Louis E. Mohrhardt, dec'd, with authority to take possession of all the property of said estate, as well as to receive said fund from said City National Bank, and receipt therefor, and to do and perform all such other and further acts as may be necessary for the preservation of said estate.

It is further ordered that the said Frank A. Mohrhardt give bond in the sum of thirty three hundred and fifty (\$3350.) dollars, and take the oath as required by law, and that this order shall be recorded in the probate minutes of the County Court of Dallas county, and this appointment shall cease to be of force on the day designated for taking up probate business at the first term of the County Court of said county, held next after the date of this order.

Frank A. Mohrhardt, who resides at the county of Dallas, in
the State of Texas, respectfully shows to the court:

That he is the brother of Louis E. Mohrhardt, deceased; that
said Louis E. Mohrhardt departed this life in Dallas county, Texas,
on the 8th day of November, A.D. 1888, intestate; that said Louis
E. Mohrhardt left an estate consisting of about sixteen hundred
and seventy five dollars, (\$1,675.00) in money, which was at the
time of his death, and is now, on deposit to his credit in the City
National Bank, of Dallas, Texas; that the said Louis E. Mohrhardt
left no heirs surviving him except your petitioner, Frank A. Mohr-
hardt, and that said Louis E. Mohrhardt left no wife or children.

Petitioner shows that said City National Bank will not pay
over said money to any one except some person legally authorized
to receive and receipt for the same.

Petitioner shows that he is not disqualified by law to act as
Temporary Administrator of said estate. He shows that for the
reasons above stated, an immediate necessity exists for a temporary
administration of said estate.

Wherefore, he prays for temporary letters of administration
upon the estate of said Louis E. Mohrhardt, deceased; and in case
the same are granted to him, he prays that in the order so ap-

pointing him such temporary administrator, he be authorized to receive and receipt for the money on deposit in said City National Bank belonging to the estate of said Louis R. Mohrhardt, deceased.
