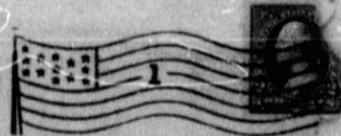
Dear Sir:--

Your letter of the 5th inst., received and in reply am sorry to inform you that Albert McCabe is in a very critical condition. He is confined to his bed and is wholly unconscious most of the time.
