


1st I wills and bequeath unto my beloved wife,

Mary J. Graves, all the property, real, personal and mixed, of which I may die seized or possessed, or may hereafter become entitled to, to manage, control, sell and dispose of, as she may think for the best interest of herself and our beloved children, William H. and Minnie J. Graves.

2nd It is my will, that my said wife, shall rear, educate and provide for our said children as best she can, without charge to them.

3rd It is my will that whatever may remain, of the property herein bequeathed to my said wife, shall at her death, be equally divided between my beloved children, William H. and Minnie J. Graves.

4th It is my will, that should either of my said children die before its majority, the one surviving shall have the interest of both; and in the event both of said children should die before their majority, then my said wife shall dispose of the property herein bequeathed at her death as she may desire.

5th It is my will, that the Courts of the County take no action in regard to my estate further than the probate of this will and the filing of an inventory of property, and that my executors hereinafter named be not required to give bond.
