Know All Men By These Presents, that I,
Charles, Seppé of the County of Dallas,
and State of Texas, being in good health
and of sound and disposing mind
and memory, do make and publish this
my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all former wills by me at any
time heretofore made.

First. I direct that all my just debts
and funeral charges shall be executed
hereinafter named, be paid out of my
estate as soon after my decease as shall
by her be found convenient.

Second. I give, and bequeath my entire
estate Real, Personal and Mixed of which
I shall die seized and possessed, or to
which I shall be entitled at the time of
my decease, to my beloved wife Julie
Moulard Seppé with full power of sale
and alienation for and during the term
of her natural life, with remainder over
after her death to her lawful heirs and
my lawful heirs to be equally divided
half and half between them.

Third I nominate and appoint my
beloved wife the said Julie Moulard Seppé
to be Executrix of this will, and direct
that no security shall be required of
her as administrator.

Fourth. It is my will that no other action shall be had in the District Court, in the administration of my estate, than to prove and record my will, and to ~~execute~~ return an inventory and appraisement of my estate.
