Your petitioner represents that at the time of the death of the said Julia Ward, she in common with your petitioner owned community property located in Dallas County, Texas, consisting of an equity in a house and lot on Reiger Avenue, in the city of Dallas, Texas, of the probable value of \$400.00 and certain household goods of the probable value of \$100.00.

Your petitioner further shows that he and his said wife had two children as follows: Mike a boy age eight years and Louella Ward a girl age four years. Your petitioner prays that appraisers be appointed to appraise the estate and that on final hearing hereof upon the filing of a good and sufficient bond conditioned according to law that he be permitted to qualify as survivor of the community estate, with authority to manage, control and dispose of the same as the law directs.
