State of Texas In the Probate Court
Dallas County January 3, 1849

To the Honorable John Hale, Judge of the
Probate Court for Dallas County, Your petitioner Elisha
S. Myman, would most respectfully represent unto
your Honor that William C. Collier late of said County
deceas'd departed this life sometime in the month of
February A.D. 1843, intestate - That he as the head of a
family, and a colonist residing with his family in the
Colony granted to W. S. Peters and others, was entitled
to 1640 acres of Land as such Colonist aforesaid -
That said decedent left some personal property, That
the probable amount of property both Real & Personal, is
supposed to be about \$1000 - That said decedent left
a widow and one Child - That your petitioners has
since intermarried with the widow and wife of said decedent.
That it is the ~~wishes~~ expressed wish and desire of the
aforesaid widow and wife of said decedent (now the wife of your
petitioner) that, he, your petitioner should take upon himself the
burthen of the administration of said estate, Your petitioner would
therefore pray this Honorable Court to grant to him Letters of
Administration on the estate of said decedent, and as in
duty bound your petitioner would remain truly &c. E. S. Myman

To the Sheriff of the County of Travis and State
of Texas greeting.

Whereas at the Regular Term of the
Probate Court in and for the County of Dallas and State aforesaid
on the last Monday in November A.D. 1847. It was ordered by
the Court that Elisha S. Mayman administrator of the Estate of Mr. C.
Collier deceased appear at the next Term of said Court for
the purpose of making a final settlement of said Estate
in accordance with Law.

These are therefore to command you
to summon him the said Elisha S. Mayman to be and
appear before the said Court at the next Regular Term
thought to be held in and for the County aforesaid at the
Court house in the City of Dallas, for the purpose of complying
with the order aforesaid. Wherein fail not and have you
then and there this notice with your proper return thereon

do witness my hand and seal of
the said Court at Dallas this 8th
day of December 1847.



Whereas at the Regular
Term of the Probate Court, in and for the County of Dallas,
and State aforesaid, at its January Term A.D. 1848 It
was Ordered by the Court that the Clerk of this Court
Shall Serve an Execution against Elisha J. Hyman and
his securities for costs due this Court, as administrator
of the Estate of Mr. C. Collier Deceased,

Thou art therefore to
Commande you that of the goods and Chattels, Land
Credits or Effects of Elisha J. Hyman William Combs
and John A. Regan, you make or cause to be
made the sum of Nine dollars and ninety cents with
Costs of Suit, and due return made to me at office
according to Law.

 Elisha S. Wyman, William Coombs and John N. Bryan
 of the County of Dallas and state of Texas, are held and
 firmly bound unto John Cole Judge of the Probate Court
 for the County of Dallas in the state of Texas, and to
 his successors in office, in the sum and sum of
 Two Thousand Dollars, for the payment of which
 sum we will and truly to be made, on behalf ourselves
 our heirs, executors, and administrators severally and
 jointly, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals
 and dated this, 25th day of January A.D. 1847.

Whereas, the said Elisha S. Wyman has this
 day, by the Probate Court for Dallas County, been
 appointed Administrator of the Estate of William C. Collier
 late of said County deceased & that
 Now the conditions of the above and foregoing obligation
 are such that if the above bound Elisha S. Wyman
 shall well truly and faithfully perform and discharge all
 the several duties and trusts committed to him and
 devolving upon him by virtue of his appointment as
 such administrator as aforesaid, according to Law, and
 do and perform such matters and things in the premises
 as may be adjudged orders and decrees by this Court
 according to Law, then and in that case the above and
 foregoing obligation to be null and void else to be and
 remain in full force and virtue in Law.

 Court this 25th day of
 January A.D. 1847.
