


Application for Probate of Written Will attached to Application before the County Court of Dallas County, Texas, sitting in matters of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of John R. Figh, deceased, your petitioner, Mrs. Minnie Figh, shows to the Court, that she resides in Dallas County, Texas. That on the 18th day of June, 1895, John R. Figh, who at, and before his death, had his domicile in the County of Dallas and State of Texas, and who in his lifetime, was a resident citizen of Dallas County, Texas, died in the County of Mitchell, State of Texas, leaving your petitioner as his surviving widow.

That at the time of his death, the said John R. Figh was seized and possessed of real and personal property of the probable value of five thousand (\$5,000) dollars, and left a written will, duly executed and herewith filed, in which your petitioner was appointed executrix and in which she is made the sole devisee and legatee of his estate.

That the said estate and property of said deceased are, in large part, located in the County of Dallas, State of Texas, where your applicant also resides.

That there is a necessity for administration upon the estate of said John R. Figh, who, at the time of his death, was indebted to various persons in certain sums of money, the exact amount of which indebtedness is, at present, unknown to your petitioner, and there are sundry notes, accounts and choses in action belonging to said estate to be hereafter collected.

That your petitioner is not disqualified by law from accepting letters testamentary, and she desires that the said will, in writing, of said Decedent, hereto attached, be now probated and established by the proper orders of this Court. That said Decedent left children surviving him who, but for said will, would inherit portions of his estate.

That by the terms of said will, your petitioner, as executrix, is relieved from giving any bond, or any security as such.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that citation be now issued in the terms of the law to parties interested in said estate. That said will under proper notice, be admitted to probate, that letters testamentary be issued to your petitioner, and such other and further orders be made as to the Court, may seem proper.



2. One note made by W.H. Baker to order of Geo. M. Perry, dated Sept 25-1891 for the sum of \$250.00 with interest at 12% from date and 10% extra if necessary, due 90 days after its date.
3. One note made by Bowder Bros dated January 1st 1893 for the sum of \$440.00 due 12 months after its date, promising for 10 per cent extra fees to be payable to order of J.M. Harry etc and endorsed by same persons, without recourse.
