John Carter a Citizen of said County has filed his petition in the District Court of said County allegging in substance as follows:

That in the year 1850. John S. Starkley who resided in Dallas County Texas left said County and State for California. That previous to his leaving he appointed David A. Badgley of Dallas County Texas, his attorney to transact all his business during his absence from the State. That the sum of \$1000 is now due in the County Clerk's office of said County.

That said Badgley under the authority of said power made sale of a Certificate No. 39, issued by John H. Peacock, Surveyor of Marion County on the 8th day of April 1850, for 320 acres of Land, of which Certificate Petitioner knows the Purchaser and located the same on a tract of Land in Dallas County, Texas on Muddy Creek about 18 miles N 57° E from Dallas.

That on the 24th of May 1850, title was granted by letter Patent from the State of Texas, to John S. Starkley.

That said Starkley died in California, and that the precise & residence of his heirs, executors, and attorney are unknown to him. Petitioner prays that Citation issue as the Law directs,

for him to said tract of land and for all other proper relief.

You are therefore commanded to cite, by publication, in the San Jacinto, for 8 consecutive Weeks, said instrument being set up and affixed upon the District Court of said Dallas County on the 1st day of the next Term thereof, to be held at the Court House in the Town of Dallas on the 16th Monday after the 1st Monday in March 1857. That and then to answer said petition.

proved in the trial of the above cause.

Plaintiff introduced in evidence the Certified
copy of the Certificate of Jesus S. Stanley for one
hundred & twenty acres of land from the U.S.
Land Office of the State of Texas.

3. A power of attorney given said Stanley to
John A. Bragley to act as his attorney in
fact to do & transact any & all busi-
ness in the state of Texas for the said stan-
ley. This power of attorney was dated 24th day
of April 1850.

3. A transfer from the said Bragley to
Asher W. Carter for the sum of \$20
acres by virtue of which the land described
in Plaintiff's petition was labeled. This transfer is
dated 17th August 1850 conveys the title of the land.

4. A patent to the land received in Plaintiff's
petition issued to Jesus S. Stanley by the
State of ~~Texas~~ in the year 1856, for 220 acres of
land by virtue of the Certificate of land in question.

5. Plaintiff proved that Jesus S. Stanley was
killed in the state of California in the year
1853.

The above is a full & complete statement
of the facts proved in the trial of this cause &



I, E. M. Pease, GOVERNOR of the STATE aforesaid, by virtue of the power vested in me by LAW and in accordance with the LAWS of SAID STATE in such case made and provided, do by these presents GRANT to John S. Clark his heirs or assigns FOREVER,

of LAND, situated and described as follows: In Dallas County on Murdy Creek, about 15 miles E 57° E from Dallas, a portion of Culp's A. #36, opened by John H. Crockett Surveyor of Morris Colony on the 8th day of April 1856, said Survey known as A. #316.

Bearing at the South corner of Jas. H. Hamilton's Survey, a stake in prairie th. old corner, a Cotton wood 26 rods E 30° S 20 rods, and an Elm 10 rods due E 30° E 33 rods.

Then with the S. E. Boundary of said Survey took west at 75 rods to Murdy Creek 7 rods N. bearing 20 S. wall success to a Forked Road 10 rods due from which a Branch of Bear's Creek 34 rods S 45° E and another 14 rods due S 20° W 4 rods.

Three South 84 rods to a Stake, a Spanish Oak 10 rods due S 88° E 5 rods another 14 rods due S 20° W 4 rods.

Three East 216 rods to a Stake, 2 Elms 10 rods each N. S 88° E 5 rods, a Locust 12 rods due S 01° W 23° 22' rods.

Three South 100 rods to a Stake in the North line of Henry H. Holls Survey, one year West of its S. E. corner, a Burr Oak 16 rods due S 12° E 5 rods, a Bush & a Dogwood 8° E 5 rods. Then with said line West at 144 rods to said Creek in all 139 rods to a Stake on the East side of a hill in a prairie, a Cottonwood 6 rods S 25° E 68 rods 2 rods due East 2 rods each Cr. S 80° E 5 rods. Three North 128 rods to a Stake in the S. E. line of Hamilton's Survey, a double Hickory 2 rods each Cr. S 80° E 5 rods. Then with said line due S 26° E 42 rods to the beginning.

Bearings Started & John S. Clark and his heirs or assigns FOREVER all the right and title hereby relinquishing to him the said -
