First - That the name of the said testator  
was Emma E. Lanier or Emma E. Lerump  
that she was once the wife of one A. D. Lanier  
from whom she had been divorced and as  
deceased believed had restored to her her maid-  
en name which was Emma E. Lerump and  
that said testatrix used and was known by  
both said names and executed said will  
by both said names, that the said testa-  
trix is dead that she died at Ennis  
Ellis County Texas on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of January  
A. D. 1884

Second The place of residence of the said
