 Thence running North 37.6 varas to a stake in the West  
 line of said Survey, from which a stake 4 inches in  
 diameter bears N 21. E 45 varas distant, Thence East 98.5  
 varas to a stake on the East line of said Survey, An  
 Elm, 4 inches in diameter bears S 8. E 59 varas, Thence South  
 276 varas to the South East Corner of said Survey, Thence  
 West 9.85 varas <sup>on the South line of said Survey</sup> to the place of beginning, and containing  
 Sixty five and a half acres of Land, The same being a  
 part of the land deeded to Elizabeth E. Fisher and George Fisher  
 by the District Court of Dallas <sup>County</sup> Texas, at its January Term  
 1858, and partitioned to them by Commissioners appointed  
 at said term of said Court, the report of said Commissioners  
 returned into <sup>at its July Term 1859</sup> Court, received, approved, confirmed, adopted


