 sum of Three Hundred Dollars for the payment  
 of which sum well and truly to be made we bind our  
 heirs and heirs Executors and administrators severally and  
 jointly firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and  
 dated this 29 day of November A.D. 1847 whereas the said  
 Crissy Parks had this day been appointed by the  
 Probate Court for the county and State aforesaid Guardian  
 of Patrick Parks and Susan Parks, infant heirs of Robert  
 Parks Dec'd. Now the conditions of the above and  
 foregoing Bonds are such that if the above Bondswoman  
 Crissy Parks shall well and truly and faithfully  
 perform and discharge his several duties and trusts  
 committed to her as such Guardian aforesaid according  
 to Law and obey all orders of said Court that may be  
 entered in the Premises, then and in that case the above  
 and foregoing obligation to be null and void else to  
 remain in full force and virtue according to Law -  
 Taken and approved by  
 the Court in open Court  
 29<sup>th</sup> day of Nov. A.D. 1847
