Be it remembered that on this day came on to be heard the final report of William J. Logan, Receiver of the Estate of William Monroy Logan and Benjamin Harrison Logan, Minors, known as Harry and Roy Logan and it appearing from said report that the sum of \$200.00 had been collected upon the insurance policy upon the life of the deceased father of said Minors, which comprise their entire estate and it further appearing that said receiver has expended \$92.92 in behalf of said Roy Logan and \$98.03 for the benefit of and in behalf of said Harry Logan and also expended \$20.00 for attorney's fees and \$10.00 to a Surety Company to make bond herein and that the expenditures incurred by said William J. Logan exceed the sum of \$200.00 so collected by him and that said entire estate is exhausted as shown by the exhibits of said final report. It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the court that said final report of the receiver, William J. Logan, be and the same is hereby approved and that upon the payment by said receiver William J. Logan, of the court costs in this behalf occurred, that the said receiver William J. Logan and his Surety, the American Bonding & Trust Co. of Baltimore City, be and they are hereby discharged and released from any and all liability herein upon the bond of said Receiver of this behalf herein, and said Receivership is declared

*closed and said Receiver discharged*

ESTATE OF WILLIAM CONROY LOGAN

AND

BENJAMINE HARRISON LOGAN, minors.

Order appointing Receiver.

January 21st, 1901.

On this day came onto be heard the application of W. J. Logan for the appointment of some suitable person to take charge of the estate of William Conroy Logan and Benjamin Harrison Logan, minors, and it appearing to the court that the estate of said minors is without a guardian and that such estate is likely to injury or waste unless some suitable person is appointed to take charge of said estate at once.

And it further appearing to the court that W. J. Logan is a suitable person to take charge of said estate. It is therefore ordered by the court that W. J. Logan be appointed Receiver of the estate of the minors William Conroy Logan and Benjamin Harrison Logan with full power and authority to collect of the Hartford Life Insurance Company the sum of \$200.00, and any other estate belonging to said minors and to take care of and hold said estate, money and property as may be collected until a guardian of said minors may be appointed or until further order of this court. Said Receiver is hereby authorized and empowered to settle with said Insurance Company by reason of any claim that the estate of said minors may have against said company on account of the death of the father of said minors upon such terms as he may deem to the best interest of said minors.

Upon the execution of a bond with good and sufficient surety, in the sum of ~~the sum of \$~~ <sup>double liability of estate of minors</sup> and the approval of said bond by this court,

said W. J. Logan, Receiver is hereby authorized and directed to enter at once upon the discharge of his duties as Receiver and to collect all money and property that may belong to or be due the estate of said minors ~~at once~~ <sup>at once</sup>.

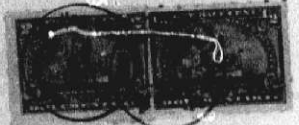

TO THE HONORABLE ED. S. LAUDERDALE, COUNTY JUDGE:

Now comes W. J. Logan, and respectively shows to the court that William Conroy Logan, age ten years and Benjamin Harrison Logan, age twelve years are residents of Dallas County, Texas, and are minors whose parents have died and have no guardian of their persons and estates; That E. M. Logan, the father of said minors died about the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 1900 with a policy of insurance upon his life with the

Hartford Life Insurance Company, in which company the said deceased carried a policy of insurance for \$2,000.00; *That said insurance company* claims that the deceased committed suicide and refuses to pay anything upon the policy, except as a compromise thereof. *and by reason of a provision of said policy there is no liability thereunder*

That the agent of said Life Insurance Company is now in the city, and is willing to compromise with said minors by paying them the sum of \$200.00 in cash if said matter can be settled and adjusted at once.

That petitioner, W. J. Logan, has consulted an attorney about the bringing of suit upon said policy, and said attorney advised him that he believes said Insurance Company has a good defense, and that it would be advisable and beneficial to the estate of said minors to compromise said claim for ~~the~~ <sup>any</sup> amount that may be realized therefrom. That petitioner believes that said amount is all that can be realized upon said

*and that it is to interest of said minors to get the sum for said amount*  
policy, and the agent of said company will pay it to-day if a settlement is agreed upon, desires to settle it at once and not delay the matter

further. That petitioner believes that further delay in the matter will likely result in injury and waste of the estate of said minors, and that this is all the estate ~~of~~ said minors possess. Wherefor petitioner

prays that the County Judge appoint a suitable person to act as receiver of said estate so that said \$200.00 may be paid at once until a guardian

*regularly determine to take care of property of said estate*  
can be appointed and for such other and further relief as to the court may seem right and proper.





Receivership of Harry Logan ;  
and Roy Logan. ; IN THE COUNTY COURT OF DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS.

Now comes W. J. Logan, receiver of the estate of the above entitled minors Harry Logan and Roy Logan, and makes this, his final report in said receivership, and asks to be relieved and discharged from all liability, together with his sureties, by reason of the bond given by him herein, and shows:

1.

That he received for the interest and estate of said minors, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), which was in full settlement of the insurance policy upon the life of their deceased father.

And your receiver shows that he has expended the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00), to a surety company for making the bond herein in his behalf, and the further sum of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) attorney's fees for services rendered as such receiver, and making this final report, which is equally chargeable to each of said minors.

2.

That in addition thereto your receiver has expended the sum of \$92.92 in behalf of Roy Logan, all of which is shown by exhibit "A" here- to attached and made a part hereof, the same covering necessities and proper expenditures made in his behalf.

That he has expended the sum of \$98.03 for the benefit of and in behalf of Harry Logan, all of which is fully shown by exhibit "B" here- to attached and made a part hereof, and which were proper and necessary expenditures in behalf of said minor.

The said two sums aforesaid, together with the expenses for said bond and attorney's fees, largely exceed the sum of \$200.00 received by your receiver for the benefit of said minors, and exhausts their entire estate.

Wherefore, your receiver prays that said receivership be closed; that he be discharged as such receiver and that he and his

sureties be relieved from all liability by reason of the receivership bond herein, and he will ever pray.
