presents that I, J. D. Meredith of the County of
Dallas, and State of Texas, being in good
health and of sound and disposing mind
and memory, do make and publish this
my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all wills by me heretofore
made.

First. - I desire and direct that all my
just debts and funeral expenses shall
by my Executor herein after named, be
paid out of my estate as soon after my
death as shall by him be found convenient.

Second. - I give, bequeath and direct to
my honored parents P. H. Meredith and
M. A. Meredith his wife, all my half interest
in a certain undivided tract of land,
the same being now occupied by my
said parents as their homestead, and
consisting of the following described parcels
of land, lying and being situated in Dallas
County Texas, to wit: One tract containing
Two Hundred and Eighty Acres of the
James H. Clegg Survey, about four miles
South of me from Dallas; also a tract con-
taining twenty acres, and being a part
of the Thomas Chesnut Survey. The whole
containing Three Thousand Acres and
being more fully described in Deed
from H. H. Clegg and wife to J. D. and M. A.
Meredith recorded in 1853, page 147-9 of
Dallas County Records of Deeds. - together
with all and singular the rights, members,
and appurtenances to the same in any

manners befitting, free from all charges or limitations whatever, nor less simple, to dispose of as they may wish.

Third - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Lou Meredith, all my household furniture, horse and buggy and the property now occupied by myself and my beloved wife as a home, in West Dallas, Dallas County Texas. to have and to hold the same to her and her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.

Fourth - Of the residue of my property consisting of money in bank, notes, accounts and real estate - all property both real and personal whatsoever and whatsoever it may be. I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mary Lou Meredith one entire half interest, to have and to hold to her and her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever. Meredith, Town & Meredith and Fred Glaser. an equal share to be divided between the three children of my deceased sister Mrs. L. J. Fifth - I constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Mary Lou Meredith sole executrix of my will, and I direct that no security shall be required of her as executrix.

Sixth. It is my will that no other action shall be had in the County Court at law in connection with the administration of my estate.


