 the County of Dallas, Guardian of the person
 and estate of the Minor Charnock Child

then if the said James M. Patterson shall ever
 and truly perform all the duties required of him
 to do under said appointment then this obli-
 gation shall be null and void otherwise to remain
 in full force and effect.

And say that the amount due the said Self from Walker the former guardian is unpaid and that he believes it would not be the interest of said Self to attempt to fore the payment of said sum of money. and the undivided interest in the Negro Mary is now in his possession. (the other moiety, being the property of Sarah D. Patterson his wife) and further say that when the two sums by \$138 00 due from Walker and \$800 00 the value of undivided interest in Negro woman, is deducted from the balance due Self there will be a balance of \$11 37 1/2 due Self and that the said Chauncey Self on the day of _____ A. D. 1852 came to the age of twenty one years. You therefore pray your Honor to accept the above exhibit as a final settlement and that he may be discharged from the further liabilities and obligations of his said Guardianship and as in duty bound he will ever pray
