You are hereby commanded to  
 cite Alexander Cockrell Guardian of James Miller  
 to be and appear before the term County Court for the  
 County aforesaid at the next term thereof to be holden  
 in the town of Dallas on the 2nd Monday in  
 December next, to shew cause why he has not rendered  
 to said Court an annual Exhibit of the condition  
 of the Estate of said ward as required by Law  
 Herein fail not and due return make as required by Law  
 (By order of the Court)

 I, Alexander Cockrill as principal and C. G. Cole  
 and J. M. Thurston as sureties are held and firmly  
 bound unto the Chief Justice of the County of Dallas  
 in the sum of \$1000 Dollars, for the pay-  
 ment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind  
 ourselves, our heirs, Executors and Administrators jointly  
 and severally, firmly by these presents, signed and sealed  
 with our seals, the seals being hereunto, this 31 day  
 of March 1867.

The condition of the above obligation is such that  
 whereas the above named Alexander Cockrill has been  
 appointed by the Chief Justice of the County of Dallas  
 Guardian of the person of the minor  
 James P. Miller.

Now if the said Alexander Cockrill shall  
 well and truly perform all the duties required of him  
 by law under his appointment, then this obligation  
 shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full  
 force and effect.
