Cooke be, and she is hereby muther and as such survivor of the said estate with authority to control, manage and dispose of said community property in accordance with the provisions of law and without any further action in this Court the said Maggie J. Cooke as said community administratrix shall have the right to control, manage and dispose of such community property belonging to said estate in such manner as may seem to her best for the interest of said estate and of suing and being sued with regard to the same.
