You are hereby notified, to be and appear before the County Court of Dallas County, in the State of Texas, at the next term thereof, to be held for probate and other like purposes, at Dallas in said county, at the Court House thereof, on the last Monday in January instant, (the same being the 31st day thereof,) then and there to show cause, if any you have, why Letters of Administration ~~recess~~
the Estate of Huyck and Ann Smith
late of said county, deceased, should not be granted to *W.C. Smith*
who has this day filed with me his application
in terms of law, praying that the same may then and there be done. This 4th day of
January A. D. 1870.

To the Hon A. Bledsoe County Judge of Dallas County

Your petitioner W C Smith who resides in the County
of Ellis and State of Texas respectfully represents
that Hezekiah Smith departed this life in Dallas
County Texas on the day of October 1853
in testate leaving an estate of the value of
Six Hundred Dollars in said County. Petitioner
further represents that after the death of the said
Hezekiah Smith Ann Smith the surviving widow
of said Hezekiah took charge of and managed
and controlled said estate the said estate being
the community property of the said Hezekiah &
Ann Smith. Petitioner further represents
that the said Ann Smith and your petitioner
purchased a certain tract of land in Dallas
County from James D Collins. that the
said Ann Smith paid four fifths of the
purchase money for said tract of land
out of the said Community funds of
the said Hezekiah & Ann Smith and
your petitioner paid the other one fifth
of said purchase money out of his own
separate funds. Petitioner further repre-

nts that by agreement and at the special
~~and request~~ instance of the Said Ann Smith the Deed
to the Said tract land was made to Geo
W Smith and your petitioner.

Petitioner further represents that after the
purchase of said tract of land as aforesaid
to wit on the day of ~~the~~ 1869
the Said Ann Smith departed this life
in Dallas County intestate so far as
your petitioner knows or believes.

Petitioner avers that the estate of the Said
Hezekiah and Ann Smith is worth about
the sum of Twelve Thousand & Fifty
Dollars.

Petitioner further represents that
he is the son of the Said Hezekiah &
Ann Smith deceased.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that
due notice hereof may be given and
that at the January of Term 1870
of your honor's Court he may be
appointed administrator of the
Estate of the Said Hezekiah and
Ann Smith deceased.
