This administrator says that he  
has ~~received~~ collected in money belonging to  
said estate \$111<sup>50</sup> for which he is  
entitled to a com of 5% making 5.57<sup>1/2</sup>

This Admin says he has paid out  
an apf of said estate \$78<sup>45</sup> for which  
he is entitled to a com of 5% making 3.92<sup>1/2</sup>

This Admin says he has been at  
considerable work and consumed  
six or more days time in the look-  
ing after and collecting up and

taking care of the property of said

worth \$10 " therefor and be charged

allowance thereof by the court \$10.00
