Know all men by these presents that, I, James H. Porter, of Dallas County in the State of Texas, am held and firmly bound unto Mary Fraucher of Dallas County and said State, in the sum of one thousand (\$1000⁰⁰) dollars, for the payment of which well and truly to be made, I bind myself, heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, signed and dated this July 2^d 1883.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above bound James H. Porter has this day had apprenticed to him by the County Court of Dallas County Mary Fraucher who was born on the 22^d day of June 1874 to be his apprentice until she arrives at the age of eighteen years, or until she marries if she marries, if she marries before that period, word if the said James H. Porter shall well and truly perform all the duties required of him by law under said apprenticeship, namely, during said apprenticeship shall furnish said Mary Fraucher sufficient food and clothing, treat her humanely and teach her or cause her to be ^{taught} the occupation of house-keeping - shall furnish

her medicine & medical attention
when necessary and shall if prac-
tical send her to school at least
three months in each year during
the continuance of such appren-
ticeship after she has arrived at the
age of ten years and which she is within
the scholastic age, and shall not re-
move her out of the County of Dallas
State of Texas without the con-
sent and leave of the County Court
of said County and shall not remove
said minor out of the said State of
Texas, then this obligation shall
be null and void, otherwise to be
in full force and effect.

that on the 16th day of
Dec. 1882, he applied to
said Court to have appren-
ticed to him Mary Francher
infant daughter of
W. C. Francher and
Mrs. M. J. Fille all
of Dallas Co. Texas -
that on the 28th day
of Aug. 1883 said
petitioner in pursuance
of a statute of 2/3 of
Revised Statutes of Texas
entered into obligation
with W. J. Souder and
Tom Scott as securities
and on the 26th day
of Aug. 1883 said
petitioner Court appren-
ticed said minor
your petitioner & said
petitioner then took
charge of said minor
& has ever since had
her in charge - that
said Mary was born
on the 2nd day of June
1874 - that ever since
she was apprenticed to your
petitioner she has been

disobedient and ungrateful - The
 petitioner has patiently
 endeavored to manage
 and direct ~~him~~ & raise
 said minor in the way
 she should be raised -
 These public records find
 it absolutely impossible
 for him to control
 & govern said minor
 without cruel treat-
 ment which your
 petition does claim
 to inflict - He
 he can not govern
 her by instruction
