


Evidence of Jacob Boydetun in
the trial of Robert G Boydetun under
Complaint of Lunacy

Jacob G. Boydetun being
duly sworn deposes and says that I
am the father of Robert G Boydetun who
was 26 years of age on the 10th day of
June Ad 1866 that my son Robert G
Boydetun is not of sound mind. He
Robert G Boydetun left my house on
the 10th day of June Ad 1866 in good
health and of sound mind and went
north as a driver of stock for one —
Mifers of Dallas County Texas. In
the latter part of October 1866 I
learned from Mifers and others that
my son Robert G Boydetun was not
of sound mind and needed care and
that he was at Newtonia in the
County of Clinton and State of
Missouri. I went to Newtonia in
Missouri and brought him (Robert G
Boydetun) home to the County of Dallas
and State of Texas. I found him about
the 9th day of November Ad 1866 and
he was not of sound mind he was
violent and dangerous so much so that
I was compelled to keep him tied and
confined. I have had to keep him
under restraint ever since Robert G
Boydetun is very dangerous and must be
restrained to prevent his doing serious
damage and injury to any person or

thing that may come in contact with him
Robert G. Boydston is a citizen of the
County of Dallas and State of Texas
