Armstrong is a minor under the age
of 14 years, that she is one of the heirs
of James Armstrong deceased & has property
as one of the legatees of said Estate, &
that she is without a Guardian. The
undersigned would further state that
said Estate has been partitioned & that the
Administrators are anxious to pay over
the distributing share of said Estate to
the proper ~~guardian~~ ^{trustee} of said minor.

said County, and Sarah is over the age
