Now J. N. Paternon Chief Justice  
of Dallas County

Your petitioner Abraham Branden-  
burg of said County and state would respectfully  
represent that the Estate of Henry  
Brandenburg of said County died in uncom-  
pleted, and his estate likely to waste and  
much and will suffer great loss unless it  
has immediate attention for that his Cl-  
aim Certificate in Peter Colony is  
undeposited and the said note not returned  
to the agent of the Company nor can a  
regular discussion be obtained unless it  
will be filed late to secure his land, and  
Your petitioner who is his father was em-  
powered that it was necessary unless after  
the last term of your Honors Court

Therefore your petitioner prays that special  
leave be granted to him for the purpose  
of filing said land claim and that the  
and further relief as the Court may deem  
proper and right to secure his interests  
and as in duty bound he will ever pray  
at Brandenburg

The State of Texas } Know all men by these presents  
County of Dallas } that we Absalom Brandenburg  
as principals and  
as testis are held & firmly bound unto the  
Chief Justice of the County of Dallas on the sum  
of Five Hundred Dollars, for the payment of which  
we and truly to be made we bind ourselves  
and heirs Executors and Administrators jointly and  
severally firmly by these presents, signed & sealed  
using Scraps for seals This fifth day of July  
1852

The conditions of this obligation are such  
that whereas the above bound Absalom Brandenburg  
has been appointed by the Chief Justice of the  
County of Dallas Administrator of the Estate of  
Henry Brandenburg deceased  
None of the said Absalom Brandenburg shall owe  
and truly discharge and perform all the duties  
required of him under said appointment then  
this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise  
to be and remain in full force and effect.

I do solemnly swear that Henry Brandenburg died  
and without leaving any lawful will to fail  
as I know or believe, and that I will truly &  
truly perform all the duties of Administrator of the  
Estate of said decedent
