County of Dallas & April Term A.D. 1865
To the Hon. J. M. Patterson Chief Justice
The undersigned Your Petitions would respectfully
present to your Honor that William J. Brown late
of Dallas County Tex. deceased departed this life
about the 1st day of March 1865 leaving a written
will in which your Petitioners is appointed
Executor thereof. And should such your Honor
Court that the said Last Will & Testament may
be Probated and admitted to record in accordance
with the Law of the State of Tex. And that the
same be confirmed as the Executor of the said Will
and Testimony of said William J. Brown and
for such other and further Orders you may
deem necessary. And as in duty bound etc.
etc pray thee

Dallas County Probate Court
Record of Wm. J. Brown's Estate
Petition of Callies Seward
dated April 6th 1865
That he be appointed as Executor of the said Will
and to Probate all process interested to come forward at the
next term of the County Court to be held at the
Court House in the Town of Dallas on the last Monday
in April 1865 and that the same is duly struck off

Dallas Tex.
April 6th 1865

J. William F. Snow, being sound in body and mind but knowing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, and being about to enter the service of the Confederate States Army, and desiring to direct the manner in which my property should be disposed of after my death, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament.

First It is my wish will and desire, that all my funeral expenses, and the expenses attendant upon my last illness, together with all my just debts, be paid off, out of any monies that may be on hand at my death, or in case there should not be a sufficiency therfor, then the same to be paid out of the first monies that may come into the hands of my Executor, either from the sale of property or otherwise -

Second I have heretofore given to my son John Wesley Snow, a colt which I will to him, and desire him to keep. I have also have given to my daughter Mary Elizabeth, a colt which I will to her, to keep as her own. - And I now will to my son Sylvester Snow, Nancy Jane Snow, and Starrett Alice Malvina Snow, one colt each, to be kept as their own, respectively. And in case I should not own colts enough to supply each with one, at the time of my death then they are each, or such of them as get no colts, to have each, an amount of money, equal in value to a colt, or equivalent to the amount which I have herein given to said John Wesley, and Mary Elizabeth, in colts - And my Executor is hereby requested to pay the amount or amounts so apportioned out of the first monies coming into his hands, after paying funeral expenses, debts &c, and should it be necessary, ^{he} shall sell

some of my property to make up the amount
Third It is my will that my wife
Ellenore Snow take possession of, and manage
and control, as she may think proper, all
the balance of the property of which i may
die possessed, during such time as she
may remain my widow, and should she
marry again, then it is my will that she
have of my property, One riding horse or
man, to be selected by her, One bridle & saddle
One Bitstead, bed and bedding, The Cooking
Stove and its furniture, and such Cupboard
man as she may desire. And the balance
of my property of every description, both
real and personal, shall then be equally
divided between all my Children, to wit
John W. Mary E. Sylvester T., Nancy J. and
Harriet A. M. Snow. Should, however, my
wife, never marry again, then she is to
have the control and management of my
property, for the benefit of all my Children
as well as for herself, according to my wish
as expressed in the first of this item, until
her death, when the same shall be equally
divided between said Children, nothing
herein contained however shall be so construed
as to prevent any one of the said Children
from asking and receiving their share or
shares of said property, whenever and as
soon as they may arrive of sufficient age
to legally take & hold property, or when
they may marry.

Fourth It is my wish will and desire
that my wife Ellenore Snow act as my sole

Executor of this my will, and I further desire
that the County Court, have nothing further to do
with my Estate, than may be necessary to
Admit this my Last will and Testament to record.
to receive from my Executor an Inventory
and Appraisement list of my property, and
a bond for the faithfully carrying out
my wishes and desires, Contained in the
above, and foregoing three pages.
