IN THE NAME OF GOD, Amen; I, Cyrus Cox, of
the County of Dallas, and State of Texas, being in good bodily
health, and of sound mind, calling to mind the frailty of life, and
being desirous of settling my worldly affairs, and directing how
the estate with which it has pleased God to bless me shall be dis-
posed of after my decease, while I have strength and capacity so to
do, do make and publish this my last will, hereby revoking all other
wills by me heretofore made.

1. I direct that all my just debts and funeral charges shall
be my executor, hereinafter named, be paid out of my estate, as soon
after my decease as shall by her be found convenient.

2. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth J. Cox,
all my household furniture, money, stock and all other personal
property belonging to me at the date of my decease, whether same
be separate or community property.

3. I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife all my re-
sidence, both separate and community, of which I may die seized and
possessor, or which I may be entitled to at the time of my decease,
to her use and benefit forever.

4. I nominate and appoint my said beloved wife Elizabeth J.
Cox, to be my executrix of this will, and direct that no security
shall be required of her as executrix.

5. It is my will that no other action shall be had in the
county court in the administration of my estate than to prove and
record this will, and to return an inventory and appraisement on
my estate and list of claims.
