I, William Caruth of the County of Dallas and State of Texas, being in good bodily health and of sound mind calling to mind the frailty and uncertainty of life, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs and directing how the estate with which it has pleased God to bless me shall be disposed of after my decease while I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish this my last will, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

FIRST: I direct that all my just debts and funeral charges shall by my executed hereinafter named, be paid out of my estate, as soon after my decease as shall by her be found convenient.

SECOND: All my estate, Real, Personal and Mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mattie Caruth to have and to hold the same to her and her heirs, executors administrators and assigns forever.

THIRD: I nominate and appoint my said wife Mattie Caruth to be Executrix of this will and direct that no security shall be required of her as executrix.

FOURTH: It is my will that no other action shall be had in the District Court in the administration of my estate than to prove and record this will and to return inventory and appraisement of my estate. In Testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand this 7th day of June A.D. 1873. William Caruth (Seal)
