The court after hearing the evidence and the argument of counsel, is of the opinion that Mrs. Waldstein should be appointed temporary administrator of said estate and that said R. H. Wells be not appointed.

It is therefore considered by the court that the said Mrs. Waldstein be and is hereby appointed temporary administrator of said estate, and is fully vested with the following powers, authority viz: 1<sup>st</sup> To take charge of all the property belonging to said estate, including money, claims on accounts, accounts, merchandise, Saloon and bar fixtures and all things connected therewith as well as the ~~business of said estate~~, and all other

property, real, personal or mixed belonging to said estate & return an inventory thereof as soon as practicable. 2<sup>nd</sup> To carry on and continue the saloon business in which the deceased was engaged in at the time of his death, for that purpose may replenish the stock with such articles as may be necessary to carry on said business, and to pay all current expenses connected with the estate of all said sales in carrying on said business.



3<sup>rd</sup> He shall have ~~of~~ the right to dispose  
of the entire stock, fixtures etc. connected with  
said business, as well as the license,
