 Mrs. M. A. Granger, Temporary Admrx. :

Now comes Mrs. M. A. Granger, Temporary Administratrix, heretofore appointed temporary administratrix of the estate of Fletcher D. Granger, on the 8th day of March, 1904, by this Honorable Court, with certain powers, as such temporary administratrix, to-wit: To collect a certain amount of insurance due to said estate from the Equitable Life Assurance Company; and also to apply said money, after collecting the same to the payment of the funeral expenses of Fletcher D. Granger and the payment of certain indebtedness due on the homestead of Fletcher D. Granger, Deceased, and the said Mrs. M. A. Granger, Temporary Administratrix, and also to take charge of and hold the said homestead, as aforesaid, at 185 Annex Avenue, Dallas, Texas, as the homestead of the said Mrs. M. A. Granger, Temporary Administratrix, and her minor children, as more fully appears of record, Minutes Probate Court, Dallas County, Texas, Book-----,page-----.

And now comes Mrs. M. A. Granger, Temporary Administratrix, and shows to the court, that after receiving her letters of administration she collected amount due on policy of insurance, aforesaid, in the amount of \$1774.39; and that there-after, in pursuance of the letters of administration she paid the funeral expenses of the said Fletcher D. Granger, in the sum total of \$238.50, as follows: To Ed C. Smith & Bro., March 23rd, 1904, \$85.00; to Mr. S. E. Rosenberg, Undertaker, Austin, Texas, \$133.50, March 24th, 1904; expenses of this administratrix, going to and from Dallas to Austin, Texas, for corpse of deceased, \$20.00..... \$238.50.

That on March 28th, 1904, your administratrix paid to Mrs. M. A. Stephenson the sum of \$1500.00, the said Mrs. M. A. Stephenson being the owner and holder of certain vendor lien notes against the homestead of this estate; that there is still due on the homestead, aforesaid, to the said Mrs. Stephenson about the sum of \$220.00.

Your administratrix further shows that after the disbursements aforesaid, in the sum of \$1736.30, there still remained a sum of \$35.89 in her hands, which sum has been expended for incidentals and necessaries of life for her and her minor children.

Wherefore, she prays that her acts and report herein be approved, and that as the purpose of the temporary administration has been accomplished, that she be discharged, and this administration closed.

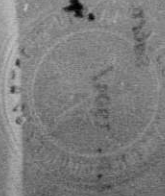

In re Estate of Fletcher D. Granger; County Court, Dallas County, Texas.
Deceased.

Now comes Mrs. M. A. Granger, wife of Fletcher D. Granger, in the above entitled and numbered cause, and shows to the court:

1. That on or about January 16th, 1904, Fletcher D. Granger, departed this life, leaving his wife, your petitioner, Mrs. M. A. Granger, and two children, to-wit: Hubert Granger, a boy ten years of age, and Fred Granger, a boy about three years of age; that they, and each of them, have been, and are now residents of Dallas County, Texas.

2. That the estate is possessed of the following property: The homestead of the family, situated at 165 Annex Avenue, Dallas, Texas, of about the value of \$3000.00, that said homestead is incumbered to the extent of about \$1500.00, with interest thereon, amounting to about \$200.00, more or less; that deceased had a life insurance policy of about the value of \$2000.00, with the Equitable Life Assurance Society.

3. Petitioner prays this Honorable Court to appoint her Temporary Administratrix, of the above estate, for the following reasons and purposes, to-wit:

First: Petitioner shows to the court that the Assurance Society fails and refuses to pay over to her the amount due her and said estate, unless she be appointed Temporary Administratrix, and she prays that she be appointed as such Temporary Administratrix, in order that she may receive the funds, which are justly due to her and said estate.

Second: She prays that after she has received the funds from said Assurance Society that she be directed and permitted to apply the same to the extinguishment of such debts as may be against the estate, to-wit: the funeral expenses of her said husband, and the said debt due on her home-stead, at 165 Annex Avenue, Dallas, Texas.

Third: She prays that as soon as the above and foregoing acts and things are completed, that she be authorized and empowered, as Temporary Administratrix, to convey to herself, individually, and her

children, the premises situated at, and located on 185 Annex Avenue, Dallas, Texas, and that said premises be conveyed and held as the homestead of the family.

4. Petitioner shows that the foregoing is necessary to be done at once, in order to prevent expenses, trouble and worry, which are, and will be, incident, to a continuation of the present state of affairs.

5. Wherefore, premises considered, petitioner prays that she be appointed Temporary Administratrix, and that she be empowered to do the acts and things set out in the premises.
