

These presents, That I James C. Garrison
of the County of Dallas, State of Texas
being of sound mind and memory - calling
to mind the uncertainty of life, and
the certainty of death, do hereby make
and declare, and publish this as my last
Will and Testament, hereby revoking
any and all wills, at anytime, here
before by me made. I commend my
soul to God who guard it, and I
desire that my body may be buried
in a neat Christian manner, without
ostentation or display, and my property
I hereby dispose of, in manner and
form as follow:

1st I desire that all my just debts
and funeral expenses be first paid
after which, I give, bequeath and devise
to my beloved wife Fannie C. Garrison
all my personal property consisting of
Stock, furniture, implements, wagons and
machinery - and all my personal
property of every kind and description
to be and become hers absolutely
and to be disposed of, by her in
such manner as she may deem fit
and proper; and I further give, devise
and bequeath, to her my said beloved
wife Fannie C. Garrison - an estate, for
life, in all the lands, owned by me
at my death.

2nd
I give, devise and bequeath to my
beloved son Cyril Garrison and to his
wife, or children, lawfully born unto

here, at any time hereafter - the following
described tract of land, land, Situate,
lying and being in the County of Dallas
State of Texas, and more particularly
described as follows "Beginning at the
East line of the Wⁿ Houston Survey
354 varas South of the North East Corner
of State, which is also the South East
Corner of the S B Rangeline Survey, thence
South 66 $\frac{1}{4}$ varas to a Stake, thence West
270 varas to a Stake, thence North 70 varas
to Stake, thence West 684 $\frac{1}{4}$ varas to the

estate.


