That she is the widow of Christian Luck, who died in the county of Dallas State of Texas on August 16th 1896,

That said Christian Luck died without leaving a will,
 That there is an estate left by decedent, which is community property, consisting of personal estate only, viz: the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars, loaned out on first mortgages as follows:

The sum of \$500. to John & Louise Lasse of Fayette Co, Illinois
 & the sum of \$400. to Charles Wasmuth of Fayette County in the State of Illinois,

That the first sum of \$500.⁰⁰ is not due yet, but that the other sum of \$400.⁰⁰ is part due & payable, and that the said Chas. Wasmuth, who owes said sum is ready & willing to pay it, provided he can obtain a valid release of the mortgage lien.

That there are funeral expenses & expenses of the last sickness of her late husband, the said Christian Luck to be paid, thus necessitating administration to be had upon the said estate.
