4th I further direct - and request that nothing shall be done in the Courts of the County save and except to probate this will and testament, and file an inventory and appraisement of my estate.

- Third. One policy of insurance on the life of the
deceased H. N. Haskell, issued by the United
Order of the Golden Cross, in which Emma D.
Haskell is named as beneficiary, the separate
property of the said Emma D. Haskell, of the
value of-----\$ 2000.00
- Fourth. One lot fronting 108 feet on east side of
Haskell avenue and running back 275 feet in
block 803 of the city of Dallas, upon which

is situated two houses, which was separate

Fifth. One lot fronting 13 feet on the east side of Haskell avenue and running back 150 feet without any improvements on it, in said block, which was separate property of the said H. N. Haskell, of the value of-----\$ 150.00

Sixth. One lot or strip of ground 10 feet wide by _____ feet long, without any improvements on it, situated immediately across the branch and fronting on the east side of said branch which is immediately in the rear and adjoins on the east the aforesaid lot of 108 by 275 feet, and which was separate property of the said H.N.Haskell, of the value of-----\$ 500.00

Seventh. One note, of which the following is a copy, of the value of-----\$ 200.00

"\$200.00 Dallas, Texas. February 6th, 1888.

At the termination or compromise of a suit now pending in the District Court of Dallas County, Texas, known as Grigsby, et al vs. W.H. Boales, et al, in which a lot of land ⁶³⁴/₁₀₀₀ of an acre this day deeded by H.N.Haskell and wife to me, is involved, I promise to pay to H.N.Haskell the sum of Two Hundred Dollars without interest until the termination of said suit by compromise or otherwise, but thereafter at the rate of twelve pr.cent.pr. annum until paid, this note is given to secure in part the payment of the purchase money on the ⁶³⁴/₁₀₀₀ of an acre of land above mentioned herein.

Eighth. The sum of \$159.00 in cash, which is community property of H.N.Haskell and Emma D. Haskell, is on deposit in the bank of Gaston & Ayers, in the city of Dallas, Texas-----\$ 159.00

Ninth. A debt of about \$160.00 due the said H.N. Haskell by Ed Cornwell, upon which suit has been brought by the said Haskell against the said Cornwell is now pending in the District Court of Dallas County, Texas, of the value of-about-----\$ 160.00

To the Honorable Judge of said Court:

The petition of Emma D. Haskell, praying for the probating of the last will and testament of H. N. Haskell, deceased, respectfully shows to the Court:

That the said H. N. Haskell died in the city and county of Dallas, Texas, on the 16th day of November, 1903; that at the time of his death deceased was a resident of Dallas County, Texas, and had so resided for a long time prior thereto, and that all of the estate of said deceased, both real and personal, is situated in said state and county; *that deceased left a last will and testament which is herewith presented for probate*

That at the time of his death deceased was seized and possessed, as the owner thereof, of certain real estate situate in the city of Dallas, Dallas county, Texas, consisting of one certain lot on Haskell avenue in said city with a frontage of 113 feet, and one certain other lot on said Haskell avenue with a frontage of 13 feet; that the probable value of such real estate is about five thousand dollars.

That at the time of his death deceased owned in cash the sum of one hundred and fifty-nine dollars, which was and is deposited in the bank of Gaston & Ayres, Dallas, Texas; that deceased and petitioner owned at the time of the death of deceased community property consisting of household goods and furniture and a horse and buggy of the probable value of five hundred dollars.

That the only debts owing by the deceased and by his estate are for medical services rendered to him in his last illness amounting to the sum of four hundred and twenty-six dollars due to

Dr. C/ M. Rosser of Dallas, Texas, and for the funeral expenses of deceased amounting to one hundred and four dollars due to Ed. C. Smith of Dallas, Texas.

That under and by virtue of the terms of the will herewith presented for probate and the codicil thereto attached, petitioner ^{who is his widow} is named as the sole legatee of the deceased and as executrix of his last will and testament, and that it is provided therein that no bond shall be required of her as such executrix, and that nothing shall be done in the county court with respect to said will except to probate the same and to file an inventory and appraisement of the estate.

That the residence of petitioner is Dallas county, Texas; that she desires to qualify herein as executrix of the estate of deceased and that she is not disqualified by law from acting as such executrix.

That deceased left no children or heirs other than petitioner, and that no ~~xxx~~ person is interested in said estate other than herself.

Wherefore, premises considered, petitioner prays that citations shall be issued herein in terms of the law and that services shall be duly made thereof and that on hearing hereof said last will and testament of the deceased shall be admitted to probate and that letters testamentary shall issue to petitioner and that such other orders shall be made herein as may be required by law.
