Know all men by these presents,
that I, Isabelle Pinpare' Boulay,
of the county of Dallas, and State of Texas,
being in good health and of sound and discre-
sary mind and memory, do make and publish
this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
all former will by me at any time heretofore
made.

First. I direct that all my just debts and
funeral charges shall by executor hereinafter
named be paid out of my estate as soon after
my decease as shall by him be found convenient.

Second. I give, devise and bequeath my en-
tire estate real, personal and mixed of which
I shall die seized and possessed, or to which I
shall be entitled at the time of my decease, to
my beloved husband Dominique Boulay, with
full power of sale and alienation for and du-
ring the term of his natural life, with remain-
der over after his death to his lawfull heir;

my daughter, Adolphine Boulay. Third I nominate and appoint my be-
loved husband the said Dominique Bou-
lay, to be executor of this last will, and
direct that no security shall be required
of him as Administrator.

Fourth. It is my will that no other
action shall be had in the district court,

in the administration of my estate than to
prove and record this will, and to return
an inventory and appraisement of my estate.
