Me xia, he was a perfect gentleman, of good judgment and entirely respectable, besides which, the national Con gress confided to him the most diffi cult and delicate commissions, such as, amongst others, those of finance and war, Gen. Mexia having been Fresident of the latter Committee.

Judging from his actions, conduct and language, the intellectual condi tion of Gen. Moxia not only appeared good, but ovon excellent and greatly above the ordinary level

Bearing in mind the age of Gen. Memin, his physical conditions did not appear that of a sickly man.

I never observed any men'al rakness or went of intellectua, forc in Gen. Mexia; on the contrary \_ diys found him perfectly capable.

I always had a good opinion of Gen. Mexia's business, and of his good ad ministration. He never was behindhand in his payments nor was he ever summonted for debt; he never abused his credit or went into risky schemes or into any gambling business. He lived ina confortable way, was always well and correctly dressed without any ostentation or pretentions to grandour; he was rather modest than estentations.
