SIEBENHAUSEN, of UNSOUND MIND.

Cause pending in the Probate Court of said county.

To the Hon Judge of said Court:

Your petitioner, John R. Charlesworth, would respectfully show to the court, that heretofore, to wit, on the 11th day of November, A.D. 1897, there came on to be heard in the county court of said county, before the Hon Kenneth Foree, judge of said court, the cause of the state of Texas --V-- Theodore Siebenhausen, charged with being a lunatic and that the Probate Minutes of said court, Page 76, show that a jury of six good and lawful men were duly empaneled and sworn to hear and determine said cause, and that said jury returned a verdict therein upon the following issues submitted to them at said time and place,

1st; that the said Theodore Siebenhausen was of unsound mind;

2nd; that it was necessary for him to be placed under restraint and that in accordance with said verdict, the said Theodore Siebenhausen was adjudged to be a lunatic and ordered by the court to be taken to the lunatic asylum at Terrell, in the county of Kaufman, state of Texas for treatment:

Your petitioner would further show that the said Theodore Siebenhausen was a bona-fide resident of Dallas county, Texas, and that he was a male person of the age of thirty three years; That at the time of his insanity as aforesaid, there were then pending in the District Court of the fourteenth judicial District of Dallas county, Texas, a certain suit for damages for personal injuries in which said suit the said Theodore Siebenhausen was plaintiff and Frank T. Buell defendant, the number of said suit being No. 15.888; and your petitioner would further show that said suit is still pendente lite and that by reason of the insanity, as aforesaid of the said Theodore Siebenhausen, he, the said Theodore Siebenhausen, is unable to further prosecute his said suit in his own name and person; and that by reason of his said disabilities there exists an imperative necessity for the appointment of a guardian of the both the person and estate of the said Theodore Siebenhausen in that his rights, interest and equities in and about said suit may not suffer waste or loss unto his

family and legal representatives.

Your petitioner would further show that one, to wit, Jacob Metzger, of Dallas county, Texas is a proper and suitable person to act as said guardian and that the said Jacob Metzger is not in any manner disqualified from so acting.

Wherefore, your petitioner prays that citation shall issue herein as required by law, and that upon hearing hereof, ~~that~~ a guardian of the person and estate of the above said Theodore Siebenhausen be appointed and for such other orders herein that may be warranted by the law and the facts and as to the court, premises considered, may seem just and equitable. and for which as in duty bound your petitioner will ever pray.

Your petitioner, Mrs. Elise Siebenhausen, of the above said county and state, would respectfully show that she is a resident of the city and county of Dallas, state of Texas; That heretofore, to wit, on the 11th day of November, A.D. 1898, one, to wit, Theodore Siebenhausen, was, in the manner and form prescribed by law, adjudged to be a person of unsound mind, said judgment being rendered in the County Court of the abovesaid county and state on the day and date last aforesaid, Hon. Kenneth Foree, judge of said court presiding, and said court having full jurisdiction thereof, and the said Theodore Siebenhausen was thereupon ordered by the said court to be confined in the lunatic Asylum situated at Terrell, in the county of Kaufman, state of Texas, where the said Theodore Siebenhausen is now ~~residing~~ residing, and that he, the said Theodore Siebenhausen, at and before the day ^{and} date of the judgment aforesaid was a resident and had his domicile in the city and county of Dallas, Texas;

Your petitioner would further show in and to the court that she is the lawful wife of the said Theodore Siebenhausen, a person of unsound mind, and that at the time of his being adjudged insane, as aforesaid, he, the said Theodore Siebenhausen, left five (5) children as the issue of the marriage of your petitioner with the said Theodore Siebenhausen, of the names, age, and sex, following respectively, to wit;=

Charles Siebenhausen, male, aged seven (7) years

Lydia Siebenhausen, female, aged six (6) years

Helena Siebenhausen, female, aged, five (5) years

Mary Siebenhausen, female, aged, three (3) years, and

Roy Siebenhausen, male, aged, eighteen (18) months

All of whom reside with your petitioner, as aforesaid;
